

## 2002 Governor's Arts Award Recipient H.T. Chen & Dancers

For the last several years, H.T. Chen has created a repertory for H.T. Chen & Dancers that has given poetic voice to the journeys of Asians becoming Americans. The dance piece Bamboo Oracle: Blan Dan follows in this tradition of creating culturally significant works in order to explore and celebrate the dramatic and dynamic interweaving of generations and cultures. Bian Dan is the Chinese word for the bamboo shoulder poles used throughout Asia to carry heavy loads, here used to represent the cultural "burdens" immigrants sometimes place on their children. The goal of the work is to bring to light, through the experiences of Asian immigrants, the issues of identity as experienced by new American families. Young children, teenagers, adults and seniors of Asian descent within the Long Island community will be prepared and incorporated into the dance performance to be given at the Chapin Rainbow Stage, Heckscher Park on Sunday, June 29th as part of the 38th Annual Huntington Summer Arts Festival. The Huntington Arts Council is serving as the presenting organization for the company's residency, which will
